



## IMP Structure and Layout



### Slide Requirements

- ❖ **Title Slide** - This slide will be similar to a TMP title slide, but it will just have your name instead of the teammate's names.
- ❖ **Background/History Slide** - The background/history slide of your presentation will also be similar to the context/background slide on the TMP.
- ❖ **Research Question Slide** - This slide should state your research question.
- ❖ **Body Slides** - These slides should support the overall argument of your presentation and paper.
  - The main claims from your body paragraphs of your IWA in slide format.
- ❖ **Solution/Resolution/Conclusion Slide** - This slide should state the solution, resolution, or conclusion to your issue.
- ❖ **Limitations/Implications Slide** - This slide should state the benefits, implications, limitations, and consequences of your main solution, resolution, or conclusion.
- ❖ **Alternate Solution Slide** - This slide should state the alternate solutions to your issue as well as the implications and limitations.
- ❖ **References Slides** - These slides should have your references in APA format in alphabetical order.
  - Only put in the sources that you used in the presentation, not all of the sources from your IWA.

### Connection to Stimulus Materials

- **Martin Luther King Jr.'s *Letter from Birmingham Jail***
  - "They, unlike many of their moderate brothers..."
- **Bob Dylan's *Blowin' in the Wind***
  - "Yes, and how many years...?"
